RESPECT, - Respect ourselves, others, and our environment, RESPONSIBILITY - Make the right choices, be responsible for my actions, RESILIENCE - Believe in yourself, Stay positive, Keep trying. We invite our parent community to join us and support this learning of behaviours. Classroom blogs and newsletters will regularly feature information about our expectations.

GOODBYE to DAVID - Our caretaker has decided to move up north to sunnier Kerikeri and so is leaving us. Fortunately he will be here for the next two weeks so we will have time to say farewell. David has been a fantastic worker for our school. He has always been ready to do whatever needed to be done with a smile. We have enjoyed his sense of humour and calm, unflustered attitude to even the high pressure times at school. We have appointed a new caretaker who will start later this month.

HEALTH and WELLBEING: We are becoming more aware of the need for ongoing health and wellbeing so we will be surveying students and staff this year.
