## A comment from the Dairy Flat Community Liaison Chairman

#### Dear Readers,

This is the third and final newsletter for this year and it has been quite a year. As at the time of writing (24 October), the world has recorded 42,234,017 cases of COVID and 1,144,714 deaths. As New Zealanders, we have also been impacted by the disease, recording 1,934 cases and 25 deaths. We have, as Aucklanders, had two Level 3 lockdowns and the sectors most affected have been tourism and hospitality. In this past week, Flight Centre announced the closure of more stores and laying off a further 160 staff ... they had about 130 branches pre-COVID and they now have about 40 branches still open to the public.

This year has also been election year and Labour was the big winner and Act was also a winner, increasing its representation in parliament from 1 to 10 MP's for the next three years. This year has also seen the stock exchange shed close to 20% of its value and then rebound and it has recovered back to values pre-COVID. Housing prices also took a bit of a dip but, they too have recovered and are now recording new highs in almost all parts of the country.

On the local front, truck movement into the landfill are still down although there would appear to be plenty of earthworks taking place, judging by the number of trucks taking clean and managed fill to various locations in and around our area. Some of those trucks have also been taking fill to the Dairy Flat/Coatesville roundabout which is now nearing completion and other fill to some new roadworks between Green Road and Bawden Road. This section is also almost complete.

The roading layout/parking at Dairy Flat School which was to have been done in July has been put on hold and depending on Council funding, may be deferred for a while. A new item for locals to consider is the North Shore Airport applying for Airport Authority status ... a public meeting is being held at Dairy Flat Hall on 29 October and I am sure that the pros and cons of what this would mean for the community will be raised and discussed at length.

In closing, I hope we can continue to keep community transmissions of COVID to a minimum which will mean we stay at Level 1 and can enjoy the festive season and look forward to 2021 with some optimism.

We had our first colour run this year, which was very successful. Our production is going ahead on the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> of November. We are planning our graduation lunch and end of year prizegiving in December and have our fingers crossed that these can go ahead.

This year we have completed a number of property projects. We have added new shade outside our new block, as well as outside our original Dairy Flat classroom. ## An update from Louise Johnston ...

2020 will be the year that we won't forget .It is hard to believe that it is almost over, and that Christmas is just around the corner. Below are a couple of updates for the Dairy Flat area.

#### North Shore Aero Club (Dairy Flat) application to become an Airport Authority:

The North Shore Aero Club in Postman's Road have applied to the Ministry of Transport to become an Airport Authority. If this is granted, the Aero Club would be able to set their own bylaws and allow for them to apply for Requiring Authority status which would enable them to use the Public Works Act to enable expansion. As part of this process the Ministry of Transport held a public meeting at the Dairy Flat Hall. At this meeting, the Aero Club presented their expansion of becoming a regional airport, capable of accommodating 80-seater planes. This public meeting was well attended by concerned locals. There was standing room only. As a result of the feedback received at this meeting, the Ministry of Transport have extended the deadline for submissions until the 30<sup>th</sup> of November. #### Green Road

Our new park at the 154 Hectare farm at Green Road is one step closer with the Local Board adopting the master plan for the park last month. We are now working on a staged implementation plan. It would be great to hear from locals that are keen to help get involved with this process. This park has the potential to be the Cornwall Park of the North Shore. Out the back are rolling hills, beautiful native bush and even a small waterfall. Hopefully locals will be able to enjoy this soon.

#### The New Roundabouts

By the time you read this the roundabout at the intersection of Coatesville Riverhead and Dairy Flat Highway (DFH) will be fully operational. This roundabout is going to be a massive safety improvement. I do believe if we don't have another serious injury at this intersection then this is a job well done, also, a very big thank you for everybody that provided feedback to Auckland Transport about the safety of this intersection, as this has helped ensure the project was given the priority it needed.

However, the roundabout at the intersection of Pine Valley and Old Pine Valley Road that is currently under construction is causing a number of issues. This is part of the infrastructure required for the Milldale development. This is only a temporary roundabout and is expected to be replaced in 2-3 years once the final Argent Lane extension through to Pine Valley Road is completed. The full opening of the roundabout is scheduled to be completed in February of next year. Many residents have queried the design. This is what I received back from the developers "the design is for large trucks to mount the islands. A car towing a trailer should be able to pass through the intersection without needing to mount the islands, vehicle speed may need to reduce to allow this. It is very intentional as part of the design that vehicles need to pass through very slowly.

As a result of all the traffic chaos on Pine Valley Road, Kahikatea Flat Road is been used as an alternative route resulting in this intersection with DFH being very congested. This is not going to get any better as thousands more houses are consented for Milldale without any concrete plans for any type of public transport for the development. Council and Auckland Transport need to lift their game on this one because DFH is starting to look very similar to SH16.

#### Safety Improvements at the intersection of DFH and Potter Road.

A number of residents have contacted me very concerned about the removal of the lefthand slip lane into Potters Road from DFH. The corner is now very sharp. As a result of these complaints, AT have completed a safety audit of the improvements. This audit was completed by an independent company and they did do a number of site visits. But they do not agree with local users about the risk of being rear ended when turning left into Potters Road from DFH. AT have said that the intersection is working as designed and that the removal of slip lanes is never popular with local users. Please let me know if you would like a copy of the report or further details.

#### The Supporting Growth Project:

The Supporting Growth (SG) project is a collaboration between NZ Transport Agency, Auckland Transport and Council. This project is planning the future transport networks for when Dairy Flat is urbanized. Unfortunately, this project is now on hold as a result of the Emergency budget. This is not good timing as a number of residents are awaiting to hear back as to if their properties are within the study area. Below is an update from their website. Personally. I think the communication around this has been poor. Please give them a call if you have any questions:

"COVID-19 has had a significant impact on Auckland Transport and the wider Auckland Council whānau. As a result, Auckland Council is implementing an Emergency Budget which has reduced Auckland Transport's budget.

Unfortunately, this means that all projects in Warkworth, Silverdale, Dairy Flat and Wainui are delayed and have now been put on hold.

We appreciate these changes may cause uncertainty for landowners and we will be in touch when we have more information to share. If you have any immediate concerns please contact us on our Freephone number, 0800 GROW AKL (0800 4769 255) or email <u>info@supportinggrowth.nz</u>"

I work with my students to discover what drives them to learn to play their instrument, which music they like and which teaching style suits them and we make a plan together to achieve what they want to learn.


